

Step 6





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When utilizing literature to teach social justice lessons, it is important to read book reviews, collaborate with media specialist or colleague(s) and, review lessons about the topic of study.




See What We See has three primary objectives:


1. To **promote engaging books** for young readers that accurately reflect the many cultures, distinct traditions, and varied realities of Indigenous and people of color in historical and contemporary contexts.
2. To **expose and track inequity** in children's publishing.
3. To provide **substantive, critical reviews** of children's and young adult books in order to create awareness of the omissions, myths, stereotypes, and distortions that misrepresent Indigenous and people of color.




